


As we are now getting closer to the end of Term 6, please can any school books (reading and library) be returned to Class Teachers by Thursday 18th July.


Year 3

In maths, children have been exploring measure and comparing different amounts with a focus on mass and length. In computing, pupils finished their 'Scratch'




unit of work by reapplying their coding skills to create mazes. Children then programmed their sprites to move around their creations.
Well done, Year 3!




Year 3 Teaching Team
